

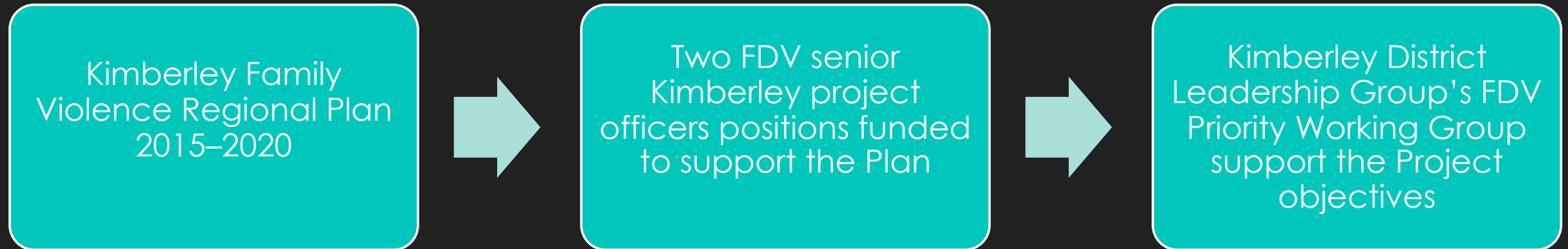

# Rationale



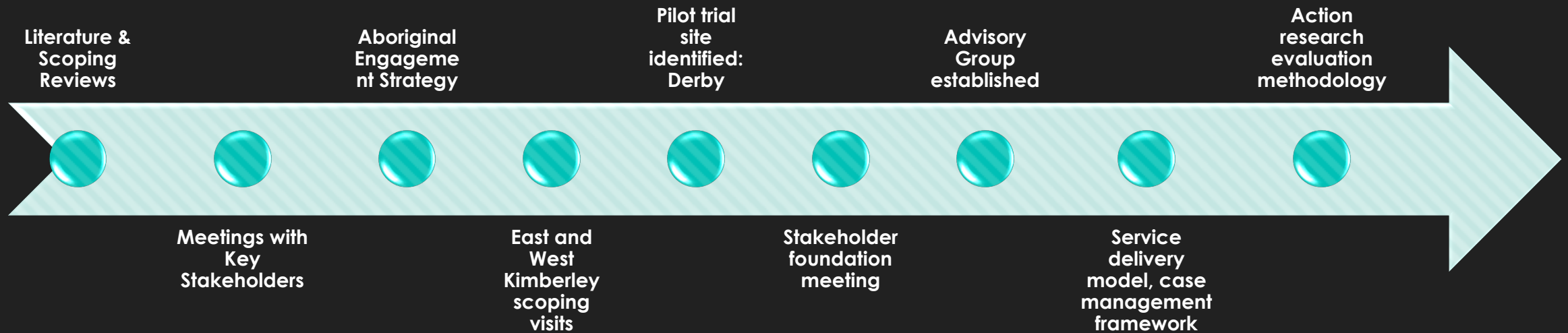
Strong links between alcohol misuse and FDV and between child abuse and FDV;

Alcohol treatment and FDV services rarely adequately meet the multiple and complex needs of many survivors and children;

Few FDV perpetrator programs or services for survivors address substance abuse in a systematic way;

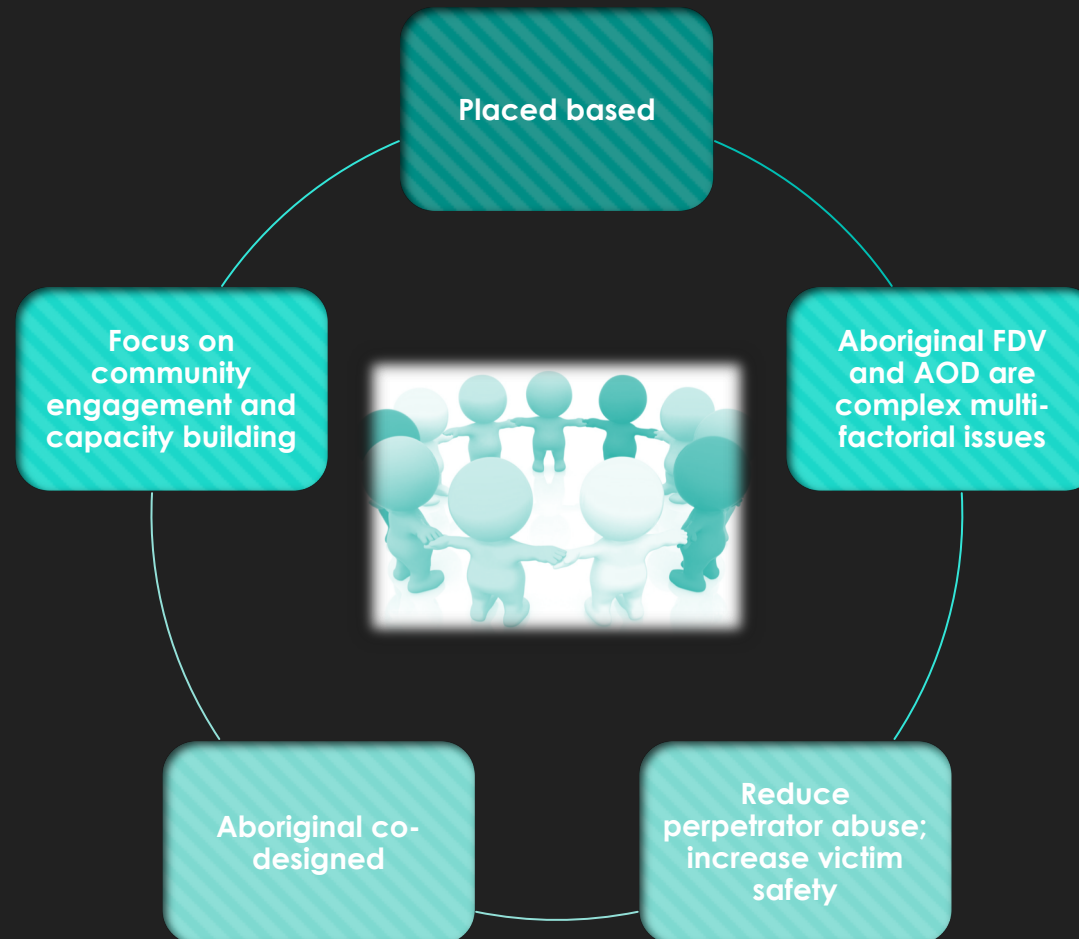
Drug and alcohol services often do not consider how AOD and FDV intersect with one another.
